

I want to thank you for the wonderful opportunities you have given me to serve another year in His Kingdom. You all are amazing women for God and I am proud and honored to be associated with you. Your friendships and sisterhood have enriched my life. Thank you for a good year together serving the Savior.

At last count we have 551 members registered for 2018-2019. This represents 30 local CWC ministries. I, personally, have worshiped with nearly 300 of you in various meetings and gatherings across Kentucky and have traveled over 4,000 miles in 2018.

The total amount you gave for the 2017-2018 state project was \$4,282.00 donated to Cumberland Mountain Outreach. Kentucky CWC Christ Birthday Offering for 2017 reported in 2018 was approximately \$62,000 and was donated from 41 churches in Kentucky. 147 dresses is the final count of dresses that went to Uganda from Kentucky. These are just a few of the works you have done that we can count. You do so much more.

KYCWC ministries and members adopt a child in the Children of Promise and are faithful to that child to adulthood, you purchase, package and send personal supplies and food to people less fortunate, you provide Christmas gifts to children in need, blankets and clothing to the homeless, supplies to homes protecting abused women and children, food and sometimes shelter to women who are trying to escape 'trafficking' or sexual enslavement. You visit nursing homes, care for the veterans, show Christ's love to young girls who have made so many poor life choices. Your tasks are endless and at the end of the year you have given everything and at the beginning of the year, you start over. Your work is endless and your talents are varied but all of you serve with a kindness in your hearts that resembles a **thirst** for more of Christ.

Thank you for being who you are, Christian Women who are Connected to Christ and each other, empowered for service in His Kingdom.

You are loved and appreciated. Many blessings, a prosperous and happy new year to each of you.

Rev. Dr. Arnetta McNeese Bailey, Executive Director of Christian Women Connection, has served the Church of God as an advocate for reconciliation, an inspired preacher, and as a servant leader. Her passionate faith informs her life and her work. Under Rev. McNeese Bailey's leadership, Women of the Church of God transformed into *Christian Women Connection* to become "a place for every woman, where every woman takes her place."

She is the founder and Executive Director of Pricilla's Lost and Found and In the Company of Good Men, faith-based mentoring programs for women and men in transition. Rev. McNeese Bailey writings can be found in *Bridges* curriculum published by Warner Press and in *Called to Minister, Empowered to Serve*.

Arnetta has served numerous organizations and ministries, serving the National Association of the Church of God, Children of Promise, Circle of Missions Committee, Executive Leadership Strategic Planning Committee of the Church of God, and the Church of God Reconciliation Task Force.

While the Church is Rev. McNeese Bailey's passion, her leadership is evident in the secular world as well where she serves on the Connect Marketplace & Religious Conference Management Association (RCMA) Advisory Board and the Buffalo/Niagara Customer Advisory Council. Arnetta also served with Special Olympics and Big Brothers & Sisters of America.

Arnetta has traveled extensively as a keynote speaker for national conferences and conventions throughout the United States. In addition to being a featured guest on the Trinity Broadcasting Network, she has preached and taught internationally in the countries of India, Zambia, Kenya, Uganda, Bermuda, and the Caribbean.

Rev. McNeese Bailey holds a degree from Ashland Theological Seminary in African American Religious Studies and a Master of Theological Studies from Anderson University School of Theology. In 2016 she received an Honorary Doctor of Divinity from Anderson University. She has three children, Merlelynn, Markus & Jamal and is the proud grandmother of two. Arnetta is a member of Sherman Street Church of God, Anderson, Indiana.

History Book Guidelines

Christian Women Connection

This is the scoring guide for 2018-19 History Books. The History Books will be judged on overall appearance of the book and content. The guidelines have not changed, only the manner in which they are scored.

Guidelines:

- 1. Pictures may be in an album, scrapbook, bound book, or 3-ring binder.
- 2. Title page (include name of local CWC ministry and name of Historian)
- 3. Include a Table of Contents, giving the start page for each listed item or activity.
- 4. Include a list of names and photos of charter members (specify lifetime, etc.)
- 5. Include the officers in your local CWC ministry.
- 6. You may include any press items or notices about meetings and activities.
- Record local history of CWC activities, including names of any special speakers, photos and information about activities, special projects, teas, retreats, etc. Include any State or National activities that your members attended.
- 8. You may use a computer or neat handwriting for labeling and writing. You may create your History Book in a digital format and print the pages. All names, places, and dates should be included where applicable.
- 9. Your book should be in order, month by month, beginning April 1st –March 31st. This matches our fiscal year.
- 10. Do not include in your book any activities that are not CWC. This includes any church activities that are not sponsored by CWC. (For example: Children's Easter Hunt, Choir Cantata, etc. should not be included.)

Appearance:

- 1. The cover should include the 2018-19 theme of Living Water or depict the spirit of your local CWC ministry. Covers will be judged on good theme, creativity, and effort and will carry a weight of 25% of the total appearance.
- 2. 75% of the total appearance will be based upon the creativity, effort, and neatness of the content inside the books.

Content:

- 1. Each Historian will fill out the "Content Scoring Guide" to submit along with their books. (extra copies will be available at convention for you to fill out)
- 2. The Content Scoring Guide will be reviewed by judges to ensure accuracy. The winning scrapbooks will be based upon the highest total.

AT CONVENTION:

1. Remember to register your book in the correct group at the History Book Table

Group 1 -under 100 Church Attendance

Group 2 -above 100 Church Attendance

2. Certificates will be awarded to each church/local historian for participation in the History Book.

Three impartial judges are selected by the State Historian.

The judges will follow the "History Book Guidelines" and "Content Scoring Guide" to determine 1st 2nd and 3rd places in each category for each group. These will be returned to each historian after judging.

Auction Guidelines

KYCWC Executive Board, in efforts to address suggestions concerning the auction, are presenting some suggested guidelines for the auction. We anticipate the following to help mostly with the length of the auction. We still ask attendees come prepared to donate.

1. Proceeds

- a. Portion of proceeds (50%) are used to fund the Youth Opportunities of the state CWC Budget. This includes scholarship to youth camps, state youth convention, and the new KYCWC Young Ambassador Awards.
- b. Remaining portion of proceeds (50%) of proceeds are used to fund State Promotions in the KYCWC Budget.

2. Donations

- a. Donations should be new, collectible, or handmade. They should include all their pieces and be in working order.
- b. Donations will be categorized for Silent Auction, Live Auction, or a Straight Sell. Details of each category are presented below.

3. Categories

- a. Silent Auction Items
 - i. Generally, all items valued less than \$10 will be placed in the Silent Auction Category. The donor may suggest a value.

b. Live Auction Items

- i. For medium and large ticket items.
- ii. Medium ticket items are those anticipated to sell \$10- \$40.
- iii. Larger ticket items are those anticipated to sell over \$40.
- iv. If larger ticket items are ready at least two weeks in advance of the convention, upload a photo and details to your FB page. Tag photo with #KYCWC #KYCWCAuction. KYCWC will share your post to generate more traffic or bids for each item.
- v. All items that may have received bids online, will still be presented in the Live Auction for a higher bid.

c. Straight Sell

- Category for multiples of an item that can sell for \$10 or less, individually or bundled; e.g lip gloss sold for \$3 each or 2 for \$5.
- ii. Items can arrive with suggestion for pricing, or will be priced by Auction team upon arrival.
- iii. Items will be available for purchase beginning at the banquet and through Saturday morning at General Assembly, or until items are sold out.
- iv. Please limit to one or two multiples to this category per chapter. E.g. one group might bring several pints of apple butter, another group might bring handmade dishcloths and scarves.

If you have any questions regarding the Auction, please contact an officer of the Executive Board for clarification.

Instead of assembling "kits", you are asked to collect items to support the **Pine Crest Appalachian Ministries**.

About Pine Crest Appalachian Ministries:

The ministry is relationship driven. We have created a family with our network of friends and supporters, with the children we work with and their families.

Outreach programs are directed by Christian individuals. We don't teach theology or argue the fundamentals of the Christian faith. We have water balloon relays, we have scavenger hunts, we have classes where simple Bible stories and morals are shared. Many of our kids come from dysfunctional homes with drug and alcohol use. Many are single parent homes or moms living with their boyfriends. All are low income.

The history of this outreach goes back to 1948 when Naomi Randall began to minister to the needs of local children. After the death of Naomi, new leadership created a sponsorship program inspired by the rich history of Pine Crest Youth Center. The camp sold but the children's ministry continues on a farm the Lacys purchased.

Pine Crest Appalachian Ministries is an integrated auxillary of the Middlefork First Church of God.

The 2019-2020 year for Kentucky Christian Women Connection begins April 1st. Let's make every extra effort possible to get the membership dues for 2019-2020 submitted by **April 1st**. Now is the time to submit your membership dues!

Save Used Stamps

Save your **cancelled** postage stamps leaving a ¼ **inch edge** around them. The stamps will be sent to Japan, where they will be sold to buy medical equipment for children and adults throughout Asia. All regular postage stamps are accepted, including US flag stamps and Forever stamps; however "**presorted and bulk mail**" **stamps are not accepted.**

You can **bring your stamps twice per year** at a CWC event and KYCWC we will mail these directly to Japan. This saves money on postage. Bring them to the Fall Connection Retreat (October) and/or to the Spring State Convention.

Mrs. Ito, a Japanese lady related to the Church of God in Saga, Japan is heading up this project. Mrs. Ito's daughter, Kazuko, became a Christian through the witness of the Church of God in Saga.
